Over 120,783 Children and teens have received new school clothes since 1965

Anytime a student has new, clean clothing it's a boost for their self esteem.

Operation School Bell is Assistance League's premier philanthropic program. We serve 15 school districts throughout Snohomish County. The school staff refer students to the Operation School Bell Program. The children can have a personal shopping experience in our facility, or receive a bag of clothing that has been specifically selected for them.

Each Child Receives:

- **Three pairs of jeans, pants, or leggings**
- **One jacket**
- **One sweatshirt**
- **Three shirts**
- **Six pairs of underwear**
- **Six pairs of socks**
- **One personal hygiene care kit**
- **One pair of shoes**
- **A book of their choice**
- **A hat, scarf, and a pair of gloves**

We also provide personalized prepacked bags of new clothing to preschool children through the Early Childhood Educational Assistance Program (ECEAP).

Qualified high school students are invited to shop for appropriate school attire at a local Fred Meyer store.



The Stats

Teen Retail Program

In partnership with Fred Meyer stores, students shopped for clothing and shoes with \$150 gift cards. This shopping experience was provided for 1,108 teens, for a total benefit of \$174,546.



Operation School Bell®

4,396 kids and pre-teens received new clothing for a total benefit of \$450,150.

Adopt-a-School

Kitty Young Auxiliary provides resources to at-risk teens to help ensure High School graduation and to provide supplemental supplies to specific schools that have a high level of students in poverty.

SOS – Fostering Independence

168 individuals and families transitioning from supported housing into independent living received kits containing necessary items to start a household, including linens and kitchenware, thanks to our Starting Over Supplies (SOS) Program.

Transitional Support

110 families and individuals in need were given a special helping hand as they restructured their lives. They received vouchers that allowed them to shop at the Assistance League Thrift Shop for clothes and household items. Homeless youth accessing services at Cocoon House were able to select new clothing at two Assistance League® of Everett sponsored Pop-up Shops.

Graduation Awards

277 high school seniors were able to celebrate their graduation by receiving checks for \$250.



Scholarships

12 adults were able to continue their higher education and better their lives through Everett Community College Scholarships.

Veterans

90 Veterans were helped through our new outreach program this year.

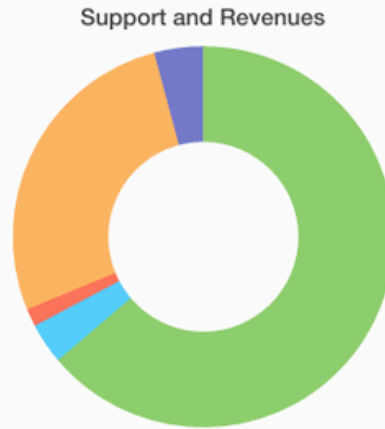

Philanthropic Committee- Literacy Project

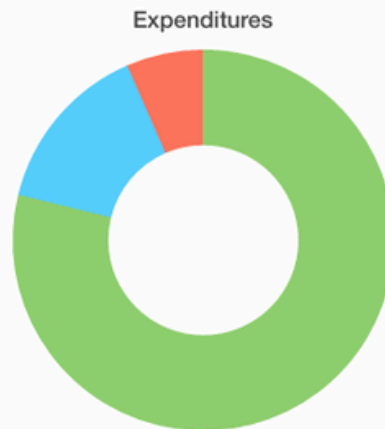
Assistance League® of Everett's Philanthropic Committee funds a yearly literacy project. In addition to gifting each kindergarten through 8th grade student with a new book, we have supported literacy throughout the county by supplying reading books for the immigrant children who attended the summer reading program sponsored by Refugee and Immigrant Services Northwest. The month-long program was held at Everett Community College. The children of recently arrived immigrant families were invited to attend to strengthen their English language and reading skills before attending school in the fall. Scores of children were given brand new, age-appropriate books to work with during the month of July. In addition, at the end of the program, each child was able to take one of the books home. It is an honor to work with Refugee and Immigrant Services and the children they assist.
